This is a bit explicit in places, but brilliant; Olivia Judson is an evolutionary biologist who in the guise of an agony aunt, receives letter from different species about their sex lives and replies, explaining how the biology of sex explains their issues.
- *The Human Story* - Robin Dunbar
Easy to read introduction to human evolution
- *Your Inner Fish* - Neil Shubin
Understand how and why we are so similar to our fish ancestors.
- *Life Ascending* - Nick Lane
A discussion of the ten greatest inventions of evolution from DNA to sex, hot blood to consciousness and finally death.
- *An Enthusiasm for Orchids: Sex and Deception in Plant Evolution* - John Alcock
A detailed account of orchids, focusing on adaptations and evolution. Lots of examples.

The History of Life on Earth

- *What on Earth Happened?* - Christopher Lloyd
Our story from the very beginning of time to the present day, taking giant narrative leaps across millennia and continents. Chemical Sciences

- *Elemental: How the Periodic Table can now explain (nearly) everything* - Tim James
Tim James, the science YouTuber and secondary-school teacher we all wish we'd had, provides an accessible and wonderfully entertaining 'biography of chemistry' that uses stories to explain the positions and patterns of elements in the periodic table. Many popular science titles tend to tell the history of scientific developments, leaving the actual science largely unexplained; James, however, makes use of stories to explain the principles of chemistry within the table, showing its relevance to everyday life.
- *A is for Arsenic: The Poisons of Agatha Christie* - Kathryn Harkup
A is for Arsenic celebrates the use of science in Christie's work. Written by Christie fan and research chemist Kathryn Harkup, each chapter takes a different novel and investigates the poison (or poisons) the murderer used. *A is for Arsenic* looks at why certain chemicals kill, how they interact with the body, and the feasibility of obtaining, administering and detecting these poisons, both at the time the novel was written and today.

Science and Society

Winner of the Royal Society's Science Book Prize 2017 - a look at Testosterone, so we're told, is the very essence of masculinity, and biological sex is a fundamental force in our development. Instead, sex, hormones, culture and evolution work together in ways that make past and present gender dynamics only a serving suggestion for the future – not a recipe.

What does it mean to be human? Transhumanism's aim is to use technology to fundamentally change the human form. Mark O'Connell presents us with the first full-length exploration of transhumanism: its philosophical and scientific roots, its key players and possible futures. From charismatic techies seeking to enhance the body to immortalists who believe in the possibility of 'solving' death.
