We will ensure that through whole school training, all staff and governors will be aware of our duties to support children with disabilities, in line with the Equality Act 2010. In implementing our Accessibility Plan, we will take into account the views, wishes and feelings of our students and their families.
3.	IMPLEMENTATION
	Our Accessibility Plan shows how access to St. Albans Girls' School will be improved for disabled students (and for staff and visitors to the school) and anticipates how we will make reasonable adjustments to support them whenever possible. We will ensure that we do so within a reasonable timeframe.

4.	MONITORING
	The St. Albans Girls' School Accessibility Plan covers a three year period but will be reviewed regularly and updated if needed. It will be monitored through the Governors' Finance, Premises and Operations Committee.
	The governing body will monitor St. Albans Girls' School's activity under the Equality Act 2010 (and in particular Schedule 10 regarding Accessibility and Schedule 13 regarding Reasonable Adjustments) and will advise upon the compliance with that duty.
	The St. Albans Girls' School Accessibility Plan may be monitored by Ofsted during Inspection processes in relation to Schedules 10 and 13 of the Equality Act 2010.
