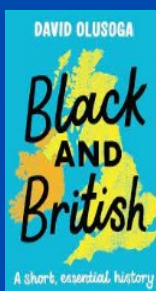
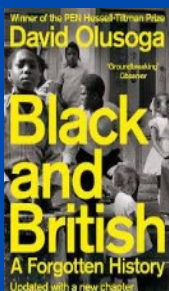

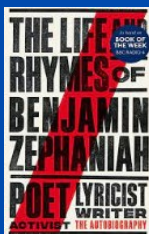

First, David Olusoga's essential 'Black and British' is available at the LRC in its original format and also the younger readers edition.

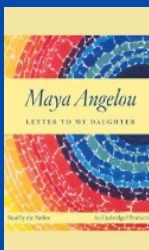
