This week, it is very saddening to read that in the United Kingdom, there are peaks and troughs of violent crime among teenagers. We are currently described as going through a peak, with the perpetrators and victims of gun and knife crime primarily being in the 15-17 year old age bracket. Childline asserts that knife crime is by far the greater danger of these two crimes for school aged young people. Sometimes these offences take place in relation to gang activity, and sometimes the cause cannot be clearly or rationally described by those involved afterwards. For your reference and information, Childline has published this information focusing on gun and knife crime including what it is and its potential consequences.


